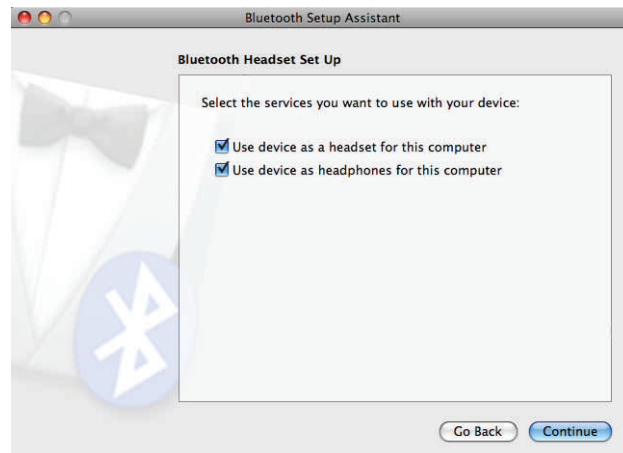


Apple OSX Leopard and Bluetooth Stereo

Pairing a stereo Bluetooth headset to an Apple computer running Leopard follows the same basic process as the previous OSX used.

1. Open the system preferences
2. Click on the Bluetooth symbol
3. Click the "+" sign to add a new device
4. Select "Headset" as the type of device
5. Put the headset in the pairing mode
6. Click the search button
7. Enter the passkey (0000)

Leopard will show you a window with the known services of the new headset. The Plantronics headsets will display both the headset and headphone options.



8. Click continue and then finish

You will be returned to the Bluetooth device window. Your product will be listed in the pane on the left. It will have a red disconnected status. Open iTunes and start a song. The computer should open the link to the headset automatically in the headphone mode.

OSX Upgrades

If you upgraded to Leopard from a previous version of OSX and your stereo Bluetooth headset was paired for headset use, you may need to delete it in the Bluetooth device window of the system preferences before you can get stereo function. To do this, click on it once in the device list to highlight it and then click the "-" sign to remove it from the list. Follow the instructions above to pair it again so that Leopard can learn the stereo service of the product.
